








# District Student Spotlight



This fact sheet shows how different student groups are performing in Ravenswood Elementary School District (Ravenswood) in English and math, as well as how the district has been performing over time.

Ravenswood enrolled 3,077 students in 2016-17. Latino, African American and Pacific Islander students make up almost all of the students in the district, with Latino students comprising the vast majority of the student population.

Despite being located near some of the highest-performing districts in the state, Ravenswood consistently performs far below the state averages for the student groups it serves. The vast majority of students in Ravenswood are not at grade level.




# School Spotlight for Ravenswood Elementary School District

- Overall, nearly all schools in Ravenswood\* are performing far below the state average.
- For each school below, the pie charts show what percentage of students are enrolled for each student group. The bar charts show what percentage of students are on grade level. Student groups were included for each school only if there were at least 20 students tested for that group. All schools had enough Latino students to be included, but only three schools (Brentwood Academy, Cesar Chavez, and Costaño) had enough students from other groups to be included.
